

PRESS STATEMENT

29 SEPTEMBER 2019

The Popular Democratic Movement (PDM) held its Electoral College in Windhoek on Saturday, 28 September 2019. We elected 105 members to the National Assembly Candidate list for the Upcoming National Assembly elections slated for 27th November 2019.

Amongst the top thirty (30) candidates, about 40 % are women and 33 % are youth.

The Movement's President and Leader of the Official Opposition Hon. Dr McHenry Venaani have been indorsed as our Presidential candidate for the upcoming Presidential election.

The Movement's Secretary General and Deputy Secretary General are not on the list, as they have to be out of parliament to keep the operation of the Movement alive.
